#### Report on the Financial Statements

1. - 5. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section 143(10) of the Act.   - i. the Company does not have any pending litigations which would impact its financial position;

  - iii. there were no amounts which were required to be transferred to the Investor Education and Protection Fund by the Company.
