BRIDAL MAKEUP WITH **GUNEET VIRDI**

When you're looking for a makeup artist who's well versed with the latest trends in makeup, look no further than Guneet Virdi! Fascinated with makeup since childhood, Guneet went on to study makeup artistry from the prestigious London College of Makeup in Dubai and skin care from Dermalogica. Since 'GV' brides are known to shine the brightest, Guneet shares her secrets with us.



: TREND TALK

Guneet Virdi Owner. Guneet Virdi Bespoke Beauty and Makeup



Getting started: I've been in love with make-up, fashion, and glamour since I was in school! When I was older, I experimented with makeup and created different looks on my friends and family, and they really liked my work. Encouraged to make a career out of it, I enrolled in the London School of Make-up in Dubai to learn the nitty-gritties. This was my first step in the world of makeup artistry.

My experience as a makeup artist: It's been good as my brides love me! Initially, it was tough as makeup artists were not given too much respect and were known as 'parlour walis'. However, as time passed, I was fortunate to have my work appreciated.

Understanding undertones and different skin types for makeup application: In the beginning, I would look at the veins on the client's wrist to know whether she had a cool undertone or warm undertone. When her veins looked greenish, it indicated that she had a warm undertone, but if the veins look bluish, she had a cool undertone. Today, I start doing makeup on a clean face and then do the basic CTM (Cleansing, Toning and Moisturising) routine according to the skin type. If the client has dry skin, we hydrate it with a moisturiser, but for oily skin, we use sweat control products, such as – a gel-based moisturiser, and then a silicone-based primer.

Products/brands used: I prefer high-end products like NARS, HUDA Beauty, Tarte, Smashbox, Laura Mercier, and others. Before I begin, I ask the client if she is allergic to an ingredient, and if yes, we skip the product or step completely.

Ideal look for a day wedding: As it's hot during the day, I prefer keeping the look minimal and subtle. If my client wishes for a hint of colour, I use a coloured kajal in the waterline or a coloured eyeliner.

Looking different from each other: None of my brides look the same! I make sure their eye makeup, lipsticks, and hairstyles are different from each other. Even the choice of base makes them look different from each other.

Makeup for a bride v/s ramp: There are three main differences – the bride's makeup should last for at least 15 to 16 hours, but on the ramp longevity does not matter. We cannot experiment with bridal makeup, but we can do so on the ramp. Lastly, we need to make sure that the makeup is as per the bride's liking, but for the ramp, a model with sharp features is given preference.

Big fan of: Winged eyeliner, pouty lips, and soft matte eyes.

GOING WITH THE FLOW

Romantic Waves

Embodying timelessness and grace, romantic waves are a perennial favourite. Soft undulating waves that delicately cascade over the bride's shoulders bestow a dreamy and ethereal aura. Crafting this style involves using a large-barreled curling iron, followed by gently brushing the curls to create an effect of soft, flowing waves. For a finishing touch that maintains a natural feel, a lightweight shine-enhancing hairspray is recommended.



Cascading Curls

Cascading curls are a classic choice that always stays in style. This look is about volume and movement, with curls flowing gracefully around the bride to-be's face. Crafting these bouncy cascading curls necessitates a dependable curling wand. For an added touch of volume, gently tease the roots before settling the curls. And to ensure the curls remain perfectly coiffed yet free-flowing, a lighthold hairspray is the ideal finishing touch.



Relaxed Ponytail

Gathering the hair into a low ponytail forms the foundation of a relaxed yet sophisticated look. A few strategically positioned loose strands framing the face add to the charm. Before securing the ponytail, gently tease the crown's roots to impart a subtle boost of volume. The inclusion of no-slip grip elastics guarantees the ponytail's steadfastness while permitting those strands to cascade effortlessly. To add an exquisite sheen, a spritz of shine spray brings the style to its full fruition.

Lastly, the traditions and weddings have become much more personal, and a great degree of customization is taking place which is like the storytelling of the couple by the families," accurately shared Gautam Gupta - Co-owner of Asha Gautam and Founder of GG by Asha Gautam.





Our cover star, Sobhita Dhulipala is known for her exceptional performance in the successful TV show, Made In Heaven and Night Manager. She may be a newbie when it comes to facing the camera but has risen to success in a short span of time owing to her has successful OTT debuts. With her versatile acting skills and ability to portray complex characters, in addition to her inclusive and modern thinking, she has managed to carve a niche in the film fraternity. As she continues to push the boundaries and addressing new-age concerns, her fashion sense in Made In Heaven proves to have captivated many fans. Strong, independent and bold, we spoke to Sobhita to know her views on the changing scape of Indian weddings.

With inclusivity being the theme of weddings in Made in Heaven Season 2, what is the one wedding tradition you adore and one you'd like to change?

I think there are a lot of the traditional rituals involved in different cultures. I find them really beautiful and somewhere they have a larger meaning. I adore traditional rituals of Indian weddings. One thing I'd like to change, maybe would be the concept of kanyadaan because I think society has come a long way from how it used to be and we don't really apply the kanyadaan principle anymore anyway, everyone's working or deemed equal, so maybe that practice is probably redundant.

If you were a modern bride, what are some of the things that would be the most important for you?

The happiness of my family would be the most important because someone recently shared something sensible and said that a marriage is for two people, but a wedding is for families. So somewhere would want my family and my partners family to be connected because I think only when these worlds merge, when they fuse together is there is a sense of a larger unit. So, I think their happiness and their connection with each other is important to me. Another thing that's important is to be present in the moment and not stressed. Many people until the very last minute are constantly running around and unfortunately, they miss out on the joy of the moment.

Tell us about your dream bridal ensemble.

For a very long time used to think that I would just do a super simple wedding, non -fussy. But I think I the dream bridal ensemble would be a saree. Since I am Telugu culturally and both my parents are Telugu and from Andhra Pradesh, so those are the wedding styles I've seen growing up. So I think I would be a Telegu wedding style bride.

A statement you swear by as a new-gen bride?

Heirloom jewellery pieces add such a classic touch and I personally feel it. Some people love to treat a wedding as a portal of having fun, but for me a, I want to be able to look at a picture from a wedding and feel like it's just timeless. It could belong in any time zone and still feel as true and as classic and timeless. For that I think it's important to be me; it's important to want to wear the style that makes you naturally feel like who you are and not just wear something just because it's cool or trending. For me it's about wearing who you are

because that's evergreen and that'll always be you.

Would you pick a red lehenga for your d-day? Why or why not?

Where I come from, we don't wear lehengas, we wear sarees. So, a red saree or a Kanjeevaram saree is one I'd pick. There's also a white saree, and both these are worn as part of the main wedding ritual (part of the pheras). But there are other ceremonies, so who knows, I may wear a red lehenga after all!

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RAPID FIRE Heirloom jewels or modern day pieces? A maximalist or minimalist bride? I'm obsessed with heirloom jewellery. This changes from time to time, but a **Heels or sneakers?** minimalist if I have to choose. Heels! Intimate wedding or a big-day Indian wedding? Traditional saree or modern drapes? Pastel or red lehenga? An intimate wedding with all the traditional Traditional saree any day! I love classic red. rituals.

Today's couples are breaking free from the rigidity of age-old customs and adopting practical ways to celebrate their love. Popular global trends like fancy and pre-planned proposals are gaining traction in India. Additionally, love marriages, particularly among urban millennials, are becoming increasingly common.

As weddings evolve, more couples are prioritizing sustainability in their decor and clothing choices, and striving for inclusivity across all races, castes, cultures, and religions. Traditional stereotypes, like the coy bride and red bridal couture, are being left behind in favour of new trends. Grooms no longer make their entrance on horsebacks, but in vintage cars. Meanwhile, emerging trends like bridesmaids' speeches and dual wedding celebrations that honour the religions and cultures of both the bride and groom are shaping the new-age Indian wedding landscape. Priyanka Chopra and Nick Jonas' wedding is a prime example of this, as they celebrated their nuptials with both a Hindu phera ceremony and a Christian wedding.

"While Indian weddings continue to hold a lot of significance for the couple and their families, there's a lot that's changing and rightly so. The bride and groom are now customizing their weddings to reflect their personalities, beliefs, and interests, while adding contemporary elements to traditional ceremonies. Families are more accepting of intercultural unions. There's also a gradual shift towards more equal roles within the wedding rituals, with some couples opting for inclusive practices. Some are also incorporating eco-friendly practices into the proceedings, reflecting a growing concern for environmental sustainability, and that's truly wonderful to witness," shared Khushi Shah, Creative Director of Shanti Banaras.

"Weddings have indeed become more inclusive, grand and multicultural. The confinement to marry in the same community is not necessarily a norm. We see a different arrangement today where people of different communities, castes and demographics are taking wedding wows," added Gautam Gupta.

Wedding Fashion

This season, brides and grooms are opting for a more comfortable and fuss-free look, natural make-up with a dewy glow, minimal make-up is gaining prominence, and subtle waves or buns with fresh flowers are trending hairstyles for women. While minimalism is gaining popularity, the trend of repurposing and wearing heirloom pieces is also on the rise. The saree however remain a mainstay. "The sarees itself is so universal that anyone, be it the bride or otherwise who wants to adorn grace and elegance, can wear a handloom saree and make a statement. However, with time we also construct prestitched, concept-based, drape styles, especially for Gen Z," adds Gautam. The concept of maximalism is not completely out, but the focus is more on quality over quantity.

The modern bride is empowered, strong, and elegant, and many are choosing to maintain their maiden name or add their husband's surname while keeping their maiden name i.e., double surnames. Finally, living together before marriage is also becoming more common in India, while the trend is at a nascent stage in India.

For Nikkah, I would like to design a Red or Pink Zardosi lehenga with intricate embroidery instead of the usual kurta shararas, for other family, one can design a nice kasab embroidery chiffon saree or Anarkali.



Gautam Gupta Co-owner of Asha Gautam, Founder of GG by Asha Gautam For a Punjabi wedding, I would go for a 3D embroidery pink - peach lehenga with a modern blouse and organza dupatta. I will use a lot of pearls in embroidery as it not only looks opulent, but graceful. For a non-bride, a nice concept saree – pre-stitched for Gen-Z and frill for millennials and above. I would love to work with shades, such as - Onion pink, Sea green or Grey-blue with knots and cut dana embroidery.

For a Bengali wedding, a nice Paithani lehenga with an organza dupatta is what I would suggest. We can surely give lucknawi saree or bandhani saree to the mother or elder siblings of the family. The Gen Z can even go for a brocade pantsuit to be playful and elegant at the same time.

For a South Indian wedding, a Kanjeevaram lehenga and a bandhani dupatta will be a unique combination with a gota embroidery blouse and belt. For the Gen Z, I would suggest an indo western-like brocade or embellished jacket and dhoti.

For a Christian wedding, I will design a rose quartz or off white colour organza gown with lots of 3D embroidery with pearls, beads and sequins for the bride. For the close family and guests, I would recommend a nice embellished chic dress in Lilac or Peach-pink colour having a layered top of feathers or sequins embellished cape top with a nice printed floral maxi dress.

Expert Tips Multicultural wedding outfit ideas by Khushi Shah

"The core of Shanti Banaras is handcrafted silk. And, it's truly wonderful how this storied textile can be interpreted into various cuts, colours and textures. A pastel-coloured silk sharara could be a wonderful choice for a nikkah; for a Punjabi wedding a classic red lehenga from Shanti Banaras would do the job; a red and white saree with intricate zari work for a Bengali wedding; a silk kanjivaram saree styled with temple jewellery for a South Indian wedding; and a white dress or even a cream-coloured saree with a train and a veil would make for a picture-perfect look for a Christian wedding."

ANJU MODI ON WEDDING FASHION TRENDS

It's that time of the year when the festivities have kicked in. The wedding season is right around the corner, and brides and grooms are finding themselves scrambling for the perfect wedding fashion for their big day. With larger-than-life celebrations and feelings of love and togetherness, Indian weddings have always been about opulence and spectacles. However, weddings have become more intimate since the pandemic as individuals seek to create more personalized experiences. Perfect outfits and wedding celebrations go hand in hand. From pretty pastels to bright hues, comfortable silhouettes and the beauty of pearl embellishments. We spoke to Anju Modi to know what's in store for brides and grooms this wedding season and how she defines the signature Anju Modi Bride and Groom.

Bridal Trends

Speaking about the key bridal trends, Anju Modi believes that brides these days like to experiment with their lehengas. Staying true to the traditional notion of wedding couture she says, "The classic Indian red colour is still the most popular choice, more so than lighter pastel colours." But she also is cognisant of the fact that new wedding traditions are leading to the reconsideration of rigid colour mandates tied to specific rituals in Indian traditions. By allowing individuals to choose colours that resonate with their preferences and identities, these modifications encourage a deeper connection to the rituals and ceremonies.

Another interesting trend spotted by her is combining Indian outfits with veils, giving them a unique twist that's a mix of Indian and international styles. "This idea is catching on and becoming quite popular in bridal fashion." Anju describes the Anju Modi bride as one that "exudes an enchanting allure, with a signature touch of adding veils in her distinctive style. In conversation with Bollywood draping expert Dolly Jain

Drapes is a majestic six-letter word that is the essence of Indian couture. Accurately described by veteran designer Tarun Tahiliani as 'the quintessential Indian thing.' The power of a perfectly draped saree, dupatta, lehenga or scarf adds immensely to its charismatic beauty. And to know more about the ever-evolving draping styles, Dolly Jain, the draping maestro shares her expert opinions.









Dolly Jain Bollywood Draping Expert

What does the term drape mean to you and how did you find yourself creating drapes that are so elegant?

The term drape for a lady, would mean making pleats, lower pleats, shoulder pleats, tucking in, and wearing a saree. For others, draping would mean, draping the curtains properly and giving it a nice fall and shaping the windows, making it look beautiful and elegant. For me, drape means the world – a world which has given me my recognition. So, I think I was born to do this. How did I find myself creating these drapes? I don't think I found myself in this; the drapes found me.

Throw light on the new draping styles that will be in focus this wedding season.

This wedding season, I think the entire focus is going to shift from lehenga to sarees. The saree has made a huge, huge comeback, and I think brides are opting for sarees. They might not go to buy new sarees, but rather wear an heirloom piece - one that was worn by their mother on her wedding day.

Brides might also opt to pair the saree with a beautiful new dupatta or lehenga. But this year, it is all about fabric play and wearing more fabric. Sarees will be like draping a lehenga and lehengas will be draped with four dupattas. If it is only a saree, then draping a saree with two dupattas. So I think it's just about adding more fabrics on you, but still making yourself feel suitable.

Any tips for men's drapes?

It's important to understand that men need draping more than women. Today, the grooms are dressed with stunning shawls, stoles, dupattas and scarves that add immense drama to the look. While women are comfortable carrying drapes, men are not so well-versed with the style. Hence, it is very important for me to drape them





properly, smartly, and stitch them at the right place, so when the drape is done, they just feel comfortable.

Draping tips if you wish to wear an unconventional saree.

The tip to drape a perfect contemporary saree is not to use too many pins. Limit the use of pins and use them only where it is most required. Try and do some stitching because the stitching will give you those seamless draping looks. As for pre-stitched sarees, I'm not a fan at all. I prefer the conventional draping method.

When draping an heirloom versus something trendy, what is the key difference?

I think an heirloom piece is something you can pass on to the generations ahead, wherein if you buy something that is in vogue, it doesn't stand the test of time. I have a saree which is a hundred years old and still looks great. When I tell you all to buy a pure handloom heirloom piece, it is because you can pass it on to the next generation. It is not only the saree that you're passing on, it's the love, it's the kind of care and it's about the feeling that you're passing on to your generation. You might not be there, but your essence in the saree will always remain. So, I think it is very important for people to understand, stop going ahead with a fast fashion, understand it's the saree. When it comes to saree, it has to be only heirloom pieces.

You recently styled many celebrities including Kiara. Tell us about the drape spotted on Kiara. We've done a couple of drapes on Kiara. The only key to making my bride look good is to make her feel comfortable in whatever she's wearing. Whether it's Kiara or any other bride. :.
